Registration Timelines - Fall 2021

Fall Registration windows should be viewable in CampusNet now, per the following schedule. Please note that ALL student windows are set at 8AM on your assigned day/date.

Monday, April 12: All students with 55+ credits as of end of Fall 2020 begin at 8AM; Tuesday, April 13: LL.M. students begin at 8AM; Thursday, April 15: All students with 35 - 54 credits as of end of Fall 2020 begin at 8AM; Monday, April 19: All students with 16 - 34 credits as of end of Fall 2020 begin at 8AM; Wednesday, April 21: All students with less than 16 credits as of end of Fall 2020 begin at 8AM; Open Enrollment begins Monday, April 26

You may not register before your appointed time (available on CampusNet- call 216/687-5050 to reset your password, if necessary) but may register anytime thereafter. You should register as close to 8AM as possible; if you delay registering, you will miss out on the priority (based on credit hours earned through Fall 2020) built into the registration system.

Also, before registering please check CampusNet to see if there are any holds on your record. You will not be able to register if the holds have not been removed. CampusNet will indicate the office that must clear the hold.

Cleveland State University's Wolstein Center Mass Vaccination Clinic

Cleveland State University continues the host the first state-federal Mass Vaccination Clinic in Ohio at the Wolstein Center.

For all information regarding vaccination eligibility, appointments and guidelines, visit Ohio Coronavirus info or call 1-833-4-ASK-ODH.

See the Q&A below for quick answers and some basic information about the operation of this center on our campus.

- How long will it operate?
 Through the second full week of May, 12 hours a day, 7 days a week, 8 a.m. 8 p.m.
- Who is managing the center?
 The Ohio Department of Health, Ohio National Guard and Ohio Emergency Management Agency will manage the Wolstein Center site with support from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), the U.S. Department of Defense, Cleveland State University, the City of Cleveland and Cuyahoga County.
- What about CSU faculty, staff and students? Can they get vaccinated?
 The center will be following state prioritization guidelines, which you can view here. Any CSU faculty, staff or students who meet these guidelines are eligible to get vaccinated at the center.
- How will our campus be affected by the opening of this center?
 Foot and car traffic is expected to increase around the Wolstein Center (but not other parts of campus) during the hours the clinic operates, as up to 6,000 vaccines are planned to be administered each day. The city, with support from CSU and our state partners, will manage traffic.
- What about parking?
 CSU will offer free parking in several garages, including South Garage next to the Wolstein Center, for people coming for vaccinations. Spots will still be reserved for students and faculty who normally park in those garages. Please click here before you come for a complete list and map of free parking options.
