SUBJECT Information received from Dr. Stephen Sheppard as to possible suspect in Marilyn Sheppard murder.

Sir:

I received a phone call from Dr. Stephen Sheppard, this date, in which he stated that he had received information that a Bernard Miller, who is a Councilman in Westlake, Ohio, was a complainant in an assault and battery case in April of 1953, in which an individual named Kaiser, was arrested for assaulting Bernard Miller.

He further stated that the trial was finally held in April of 1954, at which time his brother Dr. Sam Sheppard testified as to the extent of injuries suffered by Bernard Miller.

He also stated that at that time, there were some threats supposed to have been made by Kaiser against his brother Sam. He further stated that he was found guilty and placed on probation.

Dr. Stephen Sheppard suggested that this individual might be a suspect in the Marilyn Sheppard homicide.
