# Illegal Search Charge Ruling Is Due Today

C o m . M . o . P . D . SEP 23 1964 Pleas Judge  
Bernard Friedman will rule today on whether two men charged with carrying concealed weapons were searched illegally.

Louis Stokes, a lawyer, asked that charges against Richard D. Chilton, 26, of 16101 Lotus Drive S.E., and John W. Terry, 31, of 1275 E. 105th Street, be dismissed because the police search of the men violated their constitutional rights.

Detective Martin J. McFadden, a 35-year police veteran, searched the pair after he found them loitering in front of a downtown jewelry store last Oct. 31, Assistant County Prosecutor Rueben M. Payne said.
