Karl Schuele turned over to the Bay Village Police on Aug 2 1955 a flash light

This light is a 3 cell flash light and appears to be an Eveready. There is no glass in the reflector and the bottom cap is broken out. The light has been damaged by striking something repeatedly and the case has been dented on the side about where a person's thumb would come. Batteries are still in the light which appears to have been in water for some time.
