SARAH BELLE FARROW

Farrow was a sister to Ethel Durkin. Durkin was murdered by Richard Eberling. Another sister, Myrtle Fray, was found murdered in her apartment May 20, 1962.

Sarah Belle Farrow received critical injuries in a fall down the basement steps at the home of her sister Ethel May Durkin. Farrow was living with Durkin at the time. She was moved from the hospital to the Wright Nursing Home in Lakewood were she died on March 10, 1970.
