## Re: SAM SHEPPARD

Because of your interest in the Sam Sheppard case, perhaps you will be interested in learning a few FACTS, to wit:

Early in the morning of the day of the murder, two residents of Bay Village were returning home from a party when the husband became ill, parked at the side of the road, turned off the car's headlights, and walked a distance to relieve his sick stomach. While waiting in the car, in close range and full view of the Sam Sheppard residence, his wife SAW Sam Sheppard speed out his driveway in his sports car - a familiar sight about town - also withh his car's headlights out, which at the mement she attributed to eversight in hurriedly responding to an emergency call. Within minutes she SAW both of Sam's brothers enter his house and they were still inside when her husband returned to their car and they continued on home.

Although this evidence was with held because of their friendship with Sam's father, now that he has passed on, this and other gossip has run rampant and widespread.
