At 10:30 this A.M. while in company with Detective Nightwine received an office assignment to contact one Mr. Less Davidson Jr of 31012 Welker Road, May Village Ohio, who has some information relative to the recent homicide of Marilyn Sheppard in that city.

Interviewed Mr. Devidson, and he stated that he received a letter from one Katharine Peaver, of 1731 East 38th Street, letter being sent registered mail and contents advising Mr. Pavidson that he should contact the writer who has some very important information, and he was of the opinion that it might be in connection with the aforementioned homicide, and he turned over to us the letter.

We went to the home of Mrs. Perver, and we learned that she is 74 years of age, and lives in three rooms at this address, that she is senerated from her husband, and she proceeded to tell us how she contacts the two spirits who inform her that Dr. Dhep-ard is innocent etc. We find that this women is a mental case and we saked her now she got in contact with Mr. Devidson and she stated that she saw his picture and an article in the paper which told of his being appointed to the Bay Viglage Council and she decided to write to him.
