Synthesis

- Function in all areas of occupation impact wellness
 - Leisure, play, & social participation as necessary as to ADLs, IADLs, sleep, work, & education
- Adaptive recreation as a Means and an Ends
- Value of interdisciplinary collaboration and community partnership
- Distinct OT skillset and perspective enhances adaptive recreation access and outcomes

Challenges

- Partnering with a site where there are currently no occupational therapy practitioners
- Navigating funding, resource, and time limitations
- Communicating and coordinating between various levels of R2C staff and community partners

Recommendations

- Advocate for OT services in nontraditional therapeutic spaces
- Implement occupational therapy services for client participation in leisure, play, and social occupations
- Seek to understand the root of occupational injustices and address barriers
