Sir:

With Detective McAugh further invvestigated the above crime. and were asigned to interview the following people, neighbors of the Sheperds.

MRS. HEIEN SCHUELE 28944 Take Road, neigh or to the west of the Sheperd home, and she relates that she was not close to either Mr. or Mrs. Shepperd, and knew very little about their activities, other than an occasional neighborhood party which both families would attend. She has no connectionw with the Bey View Hospitel, and most of her connection with the Shepperds was being neighbors. Further stated that she had never seen Dr. S. Shepperd exhibit a tempre, but that he did occasionally become furious when his wife was not home on time, Mrs. Schuele permitted us to look at her furnace in the basement, which contined what appeared to be paper ashed, es she stated that yesterday they had burned all the papers around the home. Questioned her as to whether Dr. Sem Shep and ever used her furnece to burn snything, as information had stated, and she states that Sam had never made ony such request. The furnece room can be entered from a rear door similar to that of the besement door to the Shepard home, but Mrs. Schuele stated that she does not know of any occasion that Dr. Shepperd ever went into the besement of her home. Mrs. Schuele appeared to be very concerative, and elso state s that she heard nothing unusual on July 4th.

MRS. CHRISTINE BRUSCIND 28950 Leke Road states that her family knew the Sheppards, but were no close friends. She states that they had attended neighborhood perties on several occasions, and the Shemards had been atu their home several times. At all of the parties at tended, Mrs. Bruseino states, there was very little drinking, and all parties broke up early. Further states that sim had always noticed that the Sheppards had appeared to be a normal married couple, and had never noticed any hard feelings between the two. Further states that she heard nothing unusual on the morning of the 4th. of July, no noises or enything else, but did states that her son Anthony, age 21, who was with one JOAN ROLAND, on the night of Jule 3rd. and morning of July 4th., had been very shary over a state ment that Joan Roland had made that the two were parked in the driveway of the Bruseino home some where around 3:30 A.M. July 4th., and that Joan Roland and Tony had seen no lights in the house (Shepperds) while they were perked there. Anthony Brascino was later interviewed by Sergt. Lockwood ebal,, and he says that Joan Roland may have said that, but all he can tell is that they passed the Shappard home some time early in the morning of July 4th., and he states that he saw nothing. Tony also states that he is a good friend of Dr. Sem Shapperd and did not care to discuss the gatter any further. Mrs. Bruseino appears to be comperative.

SARA MAE LOCMIS 29128 Lake Road., school teacher at Glenview Grade School, Bay Village, Chio, who resides with Mrs. Lucy Chamberlain, a widow who owns the above home. Miss Loomis states that she does not know Dr. Sam Sheprard, and only met Mrs. Marilyn Sheppard once and the was through the fact that "Chin" Shep and was in her class at the school. Miss Locals states that she knows nothing about the private lives of either of the Shepperds, did not associate with them. She did dtate that she know that Mrs. Marilyn Sheppard and Chin were out of town on the week and of June

as xxxx Chip was supposed to have come to school on the lith. of June to get his report card, and Mrs. Marilyn Shappard called on June 9th., requesting that Chip be permitted to get his report card the following week, as they were going out of town together. This information may have some bearing on information given to the Cuyahoge Cou ty Prosectors Office by one JESSIE DILL who related to the prosecutors that she had met Marilyn on a beach near Painsville, Ohio, and during the meeting, Marilyn had confided that she had been having marital difficulties. Miss Loomis states that she can give no further information, and states that she heard nothing unusual on the morning of July 4th., having retired early. She is also almost positive

that Mrs. Lucy Chamberlain, with whom she lives, can furnish nothing further . MRS. NANCY AHERN 29146 Lake Road, who had elready testified at the Inquest held by Coroner Gerber, and she relates that her busband and herself were very close friends of the Dr. Sem Shepperds, visited each other very often, and were the people who were with the Shepperds on the evening of July 3rd. at the Shepperds home. Shereiterated her story as originally told, of having cocktall st her home, and then all four, the Sheppards and herns had gone to the Sheppards home, for dinner, and they had spent the balance of the evening with the Sheprards, leaving aroundmidnight, and of having locked the door leading to them beck yord and porch. Mrs. Agern further stated that she had never seen Dr. Sem Shepperd drink to eny excess, drinking mostly beer efter his meels. She does sto to that Sam loved attention, and did pay attention to women, but states that she had never seen him make any over affectionate engrosces to any woman. She states that most women were attracted to Sam Shep ard, but she further states that the group which she associated with were not heavy drinkers, and there never were any partiestes that got out of hand. She did state that the Sheppards also belonged to other dence groups, but as to the type of parties the other groups held, she was no familiar. Mrs. Ahern then stated that she learned of Marilyn being pregnant about 2 week prior to the murder, and Marilyn appeared to be very happy about the pregnancy. We quest oned Mrs. Agern as to how Dr. Sem Shepperd felt about his wife's preg. nency, end Mrs. hern relates that Marilyn had always said that she wented children, but related that Sem was not in favoroffa larger family because of the edded responsibility and expense. At this point she related that Sam Shepperd was very close with his money and would not permit Marilyn to buy new furniture and other things for the house, although he would spend money on things that he thought were needed fo his pressure. We questioned Mrs. Abern as to whether she knew or not that Dr. Sem Sheppard was Sterils end she stated that Marilyn had mentioned that he thought the constant x-ray work that he did may have temporarily caused sterility, but she did not know for certain wasther Dr. onm was terile. This question had been brought up when there had been a discussion as to why there were no other ch'l ren in the Shapperd home. Mrs. Ahern states that the following incident was not related to anybody up to this point, but she believes that it should be known nows She relates that she had gone to the home of Marilyn Shepperd one day some time ago and noticed that Merilyn seemed to be depressed, and during a discussion Merilyn had told her about Sem having an after or an infetuation with a girl that was presently in California, and this they the Shappards were in California and knew that Sam was seeing this girl, a former Clevelander. We then were assigned to investigate the following information that had been recieved by this department, relative to the above crime.

#26---Information through so reh of study of Dr. Sem Shep and in which the name of JEAN BYENE 1613 Robinwood Ave., Lakewood, Chio was found written on a serap of paper. Went to this address, where we interviewed MES. MARIE MAGAN, who states that Jean Byrne did reside at her home up until two years ago when she laft after being married to a F.N.U. CHURCH. She states that she did hear that Jean was working at Huron Road Hospital at present, and that Jean had been employed at Eay View Hospital for three years, being in charge of the Record room at that Hospital. Mrs. Hagan also states that Dr. Sem Sheppard did brain surgery on Jean, after Jean had suffered a concussion. She states that the only time she ever saw Dr. Sheppard was when he visited the house after Jean was released from the hospital. She does not be lieve that Jean ever went out with Sem Sheppard. REQUEST THAT HURON ROAD HOSPITAL BE CONTACTED TO SEE IF JEAN CHURCH IS EMPLOYED THERE AND QUESTION THIS SUBJECT.

#28 --Information that one ERNEST FARR 50021 Take Road, was supposed to have seen a light or lights in the Shappard residence at about 4:00 A.M. July 4th.1954. Mr. Farr states that he was driving home and passed the Shappards residence at that time, but cannot possitively state whether he saw light or not. He states that he volenteered this information the day following the crime, but also states that he cannot be certain that he saw any lights.

#30 -- Recleved information that one NANCY MOYER 479 Kenilworth Road, Bay Village Ohio had heard a remark that Marilyn Sheppard had told some girls that "Chip her son was illigitamte. We interviewed Mancy Moyer, age 17, white, single, who is employed as a Nurses 'id at the Bay View Hospital forthe rest three Years, THIS YOUNG LADY WAS VERY RELUCTANT TO TELL US ANYTHING STTING THAT APTER THE MURDER, THE HELP AT THE HOSPITAL HAD DISCUSSED THE MATTER AND AGREED THAT NO ONE SHOULD TELL ANY OF THE AUTHORITIES ANYTHING ABOUT DR. Miss Moyer finally stated that one JEAN DISBROW, who re-SAM SHEP ARD. sides directly across the street from Merilyn Shepperds home, and is known to be very freindly with Merilyn Shepperd, had told her (Nancy Moyer) that Marilyn was driving several girls to a basketball game during the 1952-1953 Besketbell sesson, and Jeen was smong them, and Merilyn had told these gris that "Chin" her son was an illigitimate boy, but the girls had understood that she had meant that Chin was not the son of Dr. Jam Sheppard. Miss Moyer stated that this was common knowledge among a number of girls that worked it the hospital. DETECTIVE NASO HAD CHECKED AT THE HOME OF JEAN DISBROW 28919 Lake Road, AND FOUND THAT THE PAMILY WAS OUT OF TOWN AND WOULD BOT WE WILL CHECK FURTHER ON THIS MATTER. HE HOME UNTIL SUNDAY OR SATURDAY. REQUEST THAT NAMEY MOYER NOT BE INTERVIEWED FURTHER AT HER HOME AND TO BE LEFT ALONE FOR A FEW TAYS AS SHE WILL CONTACT MEIN EVENT SHE LEARNE ANYTHING FURTHER.
