This date while essigned with Det. Gereau further investigated the above report.

We met Dr. Gerber and Chief Eston at 28924 Westleke Road and learned the following facts from Dr. Gerber. Dr. E.R. Hexter had exemined Dr. Sheppard and the only outward injury he could find was the swelling around the right eye and cheek. He could find no visable injury to the back of the neck but that Dr. Sheppard complained of the back of the neck being sore and tender. Also the trousers of Dr. Sheppards had been exemined and found there were what appeared to be blood spotson both trouser legs. Also the chips of teeth found under the victim had come from the victims mouth.

We then questioned Doh Ahearn and he stated that his wife had locked the door leading out to the porch and she also put the chain lock on this door. Mrs Sheppard then let them out the dor leading to lake Road. He does not know if Mrs. Sheppard then locked this door. He stated that at the time Dr. Sheppard had laid down on the couch he did not have on his wrist watch or key chain, he does not know if the doctor did have on his class ring or not. Also that Mrs. Sheppard had her wrist watch on up until the time he and his wife left the house. Also at the time Dr. Sheppard laid down he had on a T shirt and up to this time we have been unable to locate the T. shirt.

We also learned from a source, who does not wosh to be reveald that Dr. Shepperd had been seeing a nurse from Beyview Hospital and that he had been going out with her several times and in fact had given her gifts, one being a wrist watch. This had happened in the last few years and when Mrs. Shepperd had found out about this there were several arguements in which Dr. Shepperd would fly into a rage. The nurse then left the hospital and moved to Los Angles, Calif. Then about six months ago there was some type of a convention in Los Angeles and that both the Shepperds had gone there. While Mrs. Shepperd was staying in the hills Dr. Shepperd was supposed to be seeing this nurse in Los Angelus and Mrs. Shepperd found out about it and there were several more arguements in which Dr. Shepperd was supposed to fly into a rage.

We were then joined by Carl Rossbach, County Detective and he was given all the information which had been gathered up to that time.

The three of us then went to Beyview Hospital where we were going to interview Dr. Sheppard. We were then informed by Dr. Steve Sheppard that we would not be permitted to question Dr. San Sheppard rless it was in the presence of the attorney they had engaged. While were there Attorneys William Corrigan and a Mr. Fetersilge arrived.
