## Six Visitors Drop In on Dr. Sam at County Jail

Six visitors dropped into County Jail late today to see Dr. Samuel H. Sheppard.

First to be admitted was the prisoner's father, Dr. Richard A. Sheppard who brought his son X-ray plates of a patient's brain cyst which he said required an immediate operation.

Dr. Sam was to have operated on the patient, a 30-year-old Bay Village woman, but the father said the operation will now have to be performed by somebody else.

Mr. and Mrs. G. R. Brown, 1861 Idlewood Ave., East Cleveland, aunt and uncle of mur-

dered Marilyn Sheppard, spent a few minutes with Dr. Sam. When they came from his cell they said they had complete "faith in his innocence."

Two sisters-in-laws, Mrs. Betty and Mrs. Dorothy Sheppard, also spent a brief time with the prisoner, bringing him fruit and fresh clothing.

The final visitor was Gerry Flick, 20, of 3137 Rocky River Dr., Lakewood, friend of Dr. Sheppard, who is studying to be an osteopath. Gerry said he thought "Sam was a great guy." He brought him sport car and "hot rod" magazines to read.
