Defense Holds Up wed 1, Sept 22, 195 on Two Moves to

Free Dr. Sheppard Two expected moves by De-

fense Attorney William J. Corrigan failed to materialize late vesterday. The lawyer said he had made

no decision yet on whether he would file a writ of habeas corpus in an attempt to get Dr.

Samuel H. Sheppard out of jail, or ask the court to move the first-degree trial to another

county. Dr. Sheppard, charged with the murder of his wife, was de-

nied bail Monday by Common Pleas Judge Edward Blythin.

His trial is expected to begin Oct. 18.

In another development Detective Chief James E. Mc-Arthur investigated a report that an official photograph of Marilyn Sheppard's body had been circulated at Lakeside Avenue Courthouse. McArthur said his men were unable to

verify the report. John A. Corlett, attorney, told reporters he was one of those who had seen the picture

and passed it on. He did not know where the picture was now, Corlett said, adding that it was not marked "official" and that there was no marking to identify it with Mrs. Sheppard. Police Chief Frank W. Story

said no photographs were missing from his files.
