CALL 75 FOR SHEPPARD JURY

Deputies Sent Out to Serve Murder Panel

Names of 75 prospective jurors for the first degree murder trial of Dr. Samuel H. Sheppard were made public today after they had been drawn from the traditional teakwood drum in a solemn ceremony.

The jury picking ritual was the first formal step to determine the fate of the 30-year-old osteopath who is accused of the brutal bludgeoning of his pregnant wife in their Bay Village home last July 4.

First name picked from the wheel by Jury Commissioner Clifford Dunham was that of Theodore J. Mayer, an electro-typer who lives at 3921 Behrwald Ave.

Deputies Serve Writs

After the rest of the names were drawn, a dozen sheriff's deputies set out to serve them with subpoenas notifying them they must be present in Criminal Court Oct. 18 for the opening of the case of the State of Ohio versus Dr. Sam Sheppard.

Deputy Thomas Moore, in charge of the sheriff's civil branch, said the servers would work through the weekend to locate the prospective jurors who are scattered throughout the county.

Common Pleas Judge Samuel H. Silbert supervised the picking of the names from the wheel in the rotunda of Lakeside Court-house.

As Dunham drew the names they were handed to Deputy Florence Slater who counted them then handed them to County Clerk of Courts Leonard F. Fuerst who marked the number on each name card as it was picked.

Will Screen Names

Lists of the prospective jurors were then sent to Common Pleas Judge Edward Blythin, presiding in Criminal Court, for distribution to the prosecutor's office, the sheriff and attorneys for Dr. Sheppard.

All the names will be carefully screened and investigated before the trial opens.

Examination of the prospective jurors at the time the trial opens will largely decide whether Dr. Sheppard will be tried in Cleveland or the trial moved to another part of the state.

Defense Attorney William J. Corrigan said it will be impossi-

ble for Dr. Sam to get a fair trial here because of prejudice created by widespread publicity given the crime.

Assistant County Prosecutor John J. Mahon said he would oppose a change of venue motion and let the prospective jurors themselves answer questions to determine whether they have formed opinions in the case.

The 13 jurors who are ultimately selected to sit at the trial and determine Dr. Sheppard's guilt or innocence will be paid \$5 a day, plus five cents a mile travel allowance to and from their homes to the courthouse.
