"We will appeal to the Supreme Court of the United States and we will immediately commence a petition for a writ of habeas corpus in the Federal ing of December refusing the District Court in Toledo." said F. Lee Bailey from his home in Boston.

If the District Court rules the previous trial unconstitutional. as Bailey claims, Dr. Sam might face a new trial.

"He could get life again, or even the chair. That is a risk we are willing to take," added Bailey.

"If there is a new trial, the defense will be conducted differently than before," the youthful attorney said.
