- 15 Ron stabalized the hillsides by planting ivy and grass.

A park in New York gave Ron and his son the ideas for the trail markers in West

- 18 West Creek used by the Boy Scouts to learn map and compass reading Some of the Boy Scouts were disappointed that the metroparks took over
- 19 management of West Creek because they viewed it as belonging to Parma.
- 20 Ron's initial vision was to have an outdoor learning center
- 21 Local school tearchers were not very receptive to the idea
