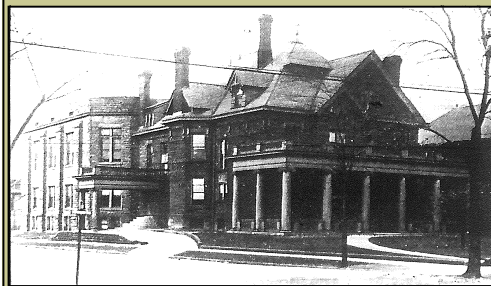
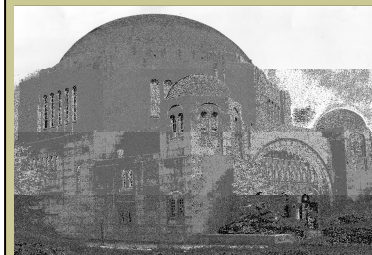

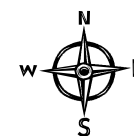

Martha House— 2032 East 90th.

Established in 1907 by the National Council of Jewish Women, Cleveland Division as a safe home for unwed and recently immigrant Jewish women unexpectedly without a reliable support system. Named in memory of the Martha Wolfenstein, daughter of the first superintendant of the Jewish orphanage (Now Bellefaire).

In 1919 after 11 years at 2234 East 46th, The East 90th location was purchased and maintained until 1927 when the Council chose other options to assist women in need. The property was sold and known as the Florentine Hotel. In 1960 The property was purchased by the Cleveland Clinic and later demolished.

Standard Club 7103 Euclid Avenue

This large home was leased in 1907 by the newly formed Standard Club, modeled after the successful Jewish social club in Chicago. Renovations and a addition with sleeping rooms was completed in 1921 under the direction of Architect Harry Cone. The building would also be occupied by the by the B'nai B'rith organization until at least 1923.

At an unknown date the building were raised and in 1946 a diner car known as American Diner was placed on the property. The first manger was Kenny King, who would later establish a restaurant chain that bore his name thought N.E. Ohio. The diner car was removed in 1955, and is under renovation. Today the property is vacant lot.
