THE COURT: Good morning, ladies  
and gentlemen.

THE JURY: Good morning.

THE COURT: Counselor Corrigan,  
would you please proceed.

MR. CORRIGAN: May it please the Court.

STIPULATION

MR. CORRIGAN: It is stipulated,  
your Honor, and ladies and gentlemen of the jury,  
by and between counsel for the defense and the  
State of Ohio, that one Larry Houk is a Captain  
in the Medical Corps serving in the United States  
Army in Korea, and unavailable to testify, and  
that if he were to testify he would testify to  
the following:

That on July 4, 1954, Larry Houk was  
sixteen years of age, and on the morning of  
July 4, 1954, with others, he joined in a search  
of the outside Sheppard premises, and approximately  
one-half way down the steps to the beach and  
approximately ten feet to the right or the easterly  
side of the said steps he found a green bag con-  
taining a watch, a key chain with keys and a ring

and that he turned the same over to Patrolman Patrick Gareau of the Cleveland Police Department.

MR. BAILEY: The defense joins in that stipulation, your Honor.

THE COURT: Ladies and gentlemen of the jury, you have heard a stipulation in open court by and between counselors for the parties in this case, and you will regard what you have just heard read as evidence in this case. The stipulation is evidence.

Proceed, counselors.

MR. CORRIGAN: The State of Ohio will call Detective Sergeant Robert Schottke.
