

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON SESSION, 1:30 P.M., NOVEMBER 9, 1966

(Thereupon the following proceedings were had in the Court's Chambers:)

THE COURT: Let the record show, Mr. Romito, if you please, that we are in Chambers, and counsel are present. Mr. Bailey has a request to make.

MR. BAILEY: The defense has in the Court House its expert, Dr. Paul L. Kirk, who has participated in this case before and made an examination of some of the physical evidence.

I am holding in my hands State's Exhibit 42, Exhibit 70, Exhibit 69, all being color transparencies of the male and female watches which have been entered as exhibits, I think No. 23 and 24, something like that.

We made a request that the defense expert, Dr. Kirk, be permitted to view these projected on the screen, that is, magnified, in order to advise counsel as to whether or not any pertinent points ought to be developed in front of the present State witness who is undergoing cross examination, Mary Cowan.

THE COURT: Counselor Corrigan?

MR. CORRIGAN: No objection on the part of the State.

THE COURT: Let's proceed, gentlemen. The request is granted.
