

that there is a disparity of view among the jurors, and that your view is shared only by a minority of the jurors, would you stick to your own judgment either in the face of majority disagreement, if you thought you were right, and continued to vote for that judgment?

A Yes.

Q Mrs. Reese, you feel with all you have heard and learned of this case, from any source whatsoever, that you can sit as a judge of the facts of the guilt or innocence of Doctor Sam Sheppard, with complete and fair impartiality?

A Yes.

MR. BAILEY: Pass for cause.

THE COURT: Mrs. Reese, would you be kind enough to take the chair next to Mr. Wycoff in the front row?

MRS. REESE: Yes.

THE COURT: Mr. Patrick and Mr. Reid, would you be good enough to bring back into the courtroom the rest of the prospective panel, please?

Gentlemen, if any of you in the back of the courtroom wish to leave, you may do so.

(Thereupon the balance of the jury panel was

brought into the courtroom.)

THE COURT: Ladies and gentlemen of the prospective panel, we are going to adjourn for the afternoon, and while you are away on your afternoon adjournment, you will bear in mind the detailed instructions previously given to you, and that is you shall not discuss this case or what little you know of it, even amongst yourselves.

You shall not permit anyone else to discuss it with you.

You shall not permit yourselves to overhear anything that relates to this case by any means or media of communication, bearing in mind the admonitions and instructions previously given that if you should pick up a written publication, newspaper or otherwise, that relates to this case, you shall not read that portion of the paper that relates to this case, or that portion of the news print.

If you should be listening to a radio, you should either walk away from the radio or turn the radio off if the commentator

makes reference to this case.

If you looking at the television set, you are to do the same, that is, to turn it off or walk away from it, so that you can not observe or overhear anything that relates to this case.

We will stand adjourned until 9:15 tomorrow morning.
