The following is the stat ement of JERRY SCHUMACHER, 18 yrs, residing at 1818 W 47th St., Cleveland, Ohio with reference to the Homicide of Marilyn Sheppard.

Around 12:00 midnight I drove my buddies Bill Hearns & George Tenaglia out Huntington Park lnoking for a beach party some of my friends were having. We left from Geaorges house about 12:00 Midnight we got out here about 12:30 A.M. or 12:45 A.M. We pulled in the parking lot on the south side of the road, and parked. We crossed the street and through the parking lot and went towards the tower next to t he pinnic area. We went half way down the stairs and looked We then went down another stairs to the left and down onto around. the beach, and walked west. We saw a light on a pier and wlked over to it and on to the pier. I said to may buddies "these aren't them" George asked them "if the was a party around anywhere?" He said "No" not that he knew of". I asked him if they were bitting and he said there's no fish out here. We left and walked back to the beach and turned left, we walked down the beach to the first stairway we came to and wlked up. We came up in somebodies back yard and walked on through to Lake Rd. back to the car.

- Q. Did you have any light to guide you?
- A. We had a flashlight.
- Q. What was the condition of the water and wind?
- A. The water was rough and high enough to wet down portions of the pter and it was fairly windy.
- Q. How many men were on the pier?
- A. I'd say three.
- Q. Were there any cars parked south of Lake Rd., where you parked when you arrived and left?
- A. Yes, when we arrived I'd say there were about 5 cars parked there. When we left I didn't notice any change in the number.
- Q. When you were on the beach and on the pier did you see or notice anything unusual, or see any other persons than the fishermen?
- A. No.
- Q. Did you see any light further on west of the pier?
- A. Not that I can recall?
- Q. The route that you showed me is to the best of your knowledge where you went?
- A. Yes.

QavHave you anything else to add to this statemtn that mey be of benifit?

- A. No, I don't think so.
- Q. Have your read the above statement and is it true?
